Where is the smallest bone in your body?

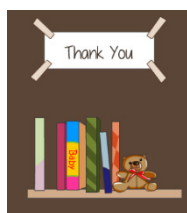

### Developing Personal Responsibility

Personal responsibility is different compliance. A child may comply with something if there is a reward or punishment associated, the child with personal responsibility will comply as they know it is the right thing to do. Personal responsibility includes;

- Δ accepting credit and acknowledging mistakes
- Δ making a positive contribution to the community
- Δ being dependable so people can rely on you
- Δ doing things to the best of your ability
- Δ being accountable for one's behaviour
- Δ keeping one's word in agreements

Everyone makes mistakes and we all know that children need support and guidance to grow and develop. To assist with this development we are introducing Two Rights across the school.

**Everyone has the right to feel safe and comfortable.**

**Everyone has the right to learn.**


Students have been exploring what these two rights mean and how they might look in the classroom, in the playground and on excursions.

We will be using the language of the Two Rights when managing behaviour and supporting children in their development. Children will be supported to;

- Δ understand how their behaviour has affected others
- Δ reflect on reasons for their behaviour
- Δ identify ways they can repair any damage caused by their behaviour
- Δ share in the selection of an appropriate consequence (when appropriate)
- Δ commit to an improvement in their behaviour

Many conversations are held daily with children in regard to behaviour and most issues are resolved at school during the school day. For those issues that require a little more discussion, teachers may decide to work through a behaviour reflection template with your child. This is a positive process not punitive, with the aim being to change the behaviour.

If you receive a behaviour reflection document from the school, we ask that you follow up with a discussion at home to reinforce the work we are doing at school.
