# Foundation Newsletter

Term 3, 2025



Within every child lies an undiscovered galaxy—spinning with questions, glowing with curiosity, and bursting with the brilliance of who they are yet to become.

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#### Literacy

This term we will be continuing to teach Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening through Little Learners Love Literacy. We will be consolidating all previously learnt letters and learn Stages 4+, 5 and 6 (morphology, suffix, multisyllabic words, ck, sh, ch,tch,th and ng) letters and sounds.

Students will keep progressing by sounding out longer words and putting them together fluently when they read. They will also continue to learn to hear the sounds in words when they write and spell, and they will consolidate beginning sentences and names with capital letters, leaving spaces between words and using punctuation correctly at the end of sentences. Students will be challenged to extend their writing through descriptive and varied vocabulary and including conjunctions such as 'and' or 'because' in their writing.

Students will continue to improve on their literacy skills through our phonological and phonemic awareness tasks.

#### Numeracy Inquiry

This term in Numeracy, the Foundation students will be moving towards learning addition and subtraction strategies and begin to explore Measurement - length, mass, capacity as well as sharing and grouping.

Students will engage in hands on activities and games to support learning. They will demonstrate length, mass and capacity through real life examples that give context and purpose to the unit.

Students will continue to learn the days of the week, months of the year and seasons as part of our daily mathematics routine.

This term, we're embarking on an exciting learning adventure centered around a big question:

#### How and why are people connected across the world?

Our Foundation learners will ignite their curiosity by building on what they already know as they explore:

What makes a place truly special?
How can we take care of the places where we live?

As they investigate, students will discover and describe the unique features of their local surroundings and observe how these places can change over time. They'll learn that people from different places may see and describe the world in their own unique ways. Students will also practice explaining where places and activities happen in their community.

Finally, they'll think about the places people call home and belong to, understanding what makes these places familiar and important. Foundation students will make a diorama of their special place to conclude the learnings.

#### Questions to ask your children other than "How was your day?"

#### **Thought-Provoking Questions**

What was the most interesting thing you learned today?

If you could change one thing about your day, what would it be?

What was something kind you did (or saw someone else do) today?

What made you laugh today?

#### **Encouraging Emotional Expression**

Was there anything that made you feel nervous or unsure?

Did anyone say or do something that made you feel proud?

Did you have a moment when you felt really happy or excited?

#### Wellbeing

This semester, students will further explore our School Wide Positive Behaviour expectations, focusing on the expectation of 'Being Safe'. Students will learn how to show this at school and in their community. Additionally, we aim to enhance students' repertoire of self-regulation techniques and their ability to articulate their feelings. We will use our Developmental Play space to encourage our students cooperation, manners and turn-taking. Students will also be participating in our Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) specialist class.
