

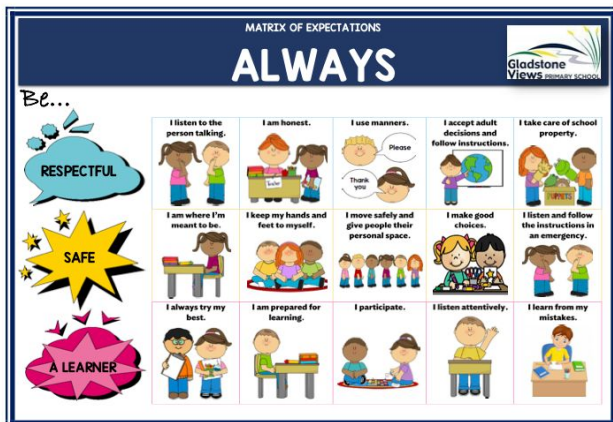

School Wide Positive Behaviour (SWPB) Support Update

Along with our school values of Kindness, Wellbeing, Integrity and Resilience students and staff at Gladstone Views Primary School have been working together to develop a 'Matrix of Expectations'. The matrix has 3 underpinning statements of:

- ➔ Be Respectful
- ➔ Be Safe
- ➔ Be a Learner

These statements frame the behaviour that students are striving for. The matrix of expectations has been split into 9 areas: Always, Learning Areas, Play Areas, Toilets and Taps, Canteen, Transitions and Common Core Areas, Assembly, Digital Technologies and In the Community. Students will be explicitly taught these expectations in the classroom. The expectations have been framed in a positive way to help guide students. GVPS will focus on Always first, please see the poster. It has been fantastic to see some of these expectations already being displayed in the classroom and playground.

IT'S TIME TO SLAP ON A HAT!

September to April is the recommended time for sun protection in Victoria. It's time to search out hats and purchase sunscreen.

Hats

Our school hat is the blue bucket style. Hats can be purchased through the school for \$10 and come in sizes small, medium and large. During the uniform changeover period children may also wear previously purchased green hats.



Sunscreen

Due to allergies and personal preferences for sunscreen, the school does not supply sunscreen for children in the classrooms. We recommend that sunscreen is applied prior to school and that children bring their own sunscreen for use, if needed, throughout the day. The small tubes that can be clipped on to school bags seem to be a good choice as they don't get lost, and children can see them which acts as a reminder for use.

Sunglasses

Children are able to wear sunglasses at school, however the responsibility for care belongs to the child. The school does not take responsibility for lost and damaged items
