2019 PARENT OPINION SURVEY

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 22rd July to Sunday 11th August.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 10-15 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

Letters are going home today to families that have been randomly selected to participate in this year's survey.

Staff Training

This week Mrs. Black, Mr Woolcock, Ms Davis, Miss Steele, Mr Moule and Miss Cheal attended two days of PLC training. PLC stands for Professional Learning Communities. At Gladstone Views Primary School all teachers plan in teams, which are also known as Professional Learning Communities. The training we are currently participating in will enhance current practices where teachers work collaboratively at the school level to improve student outcomes. This week we worked together to investigate the WHY and WHAT of PLCs at our school. This program runs over 8 modules that take place over Term 3 and part of Term 4.

the 20th of August for the chance to make the State Finals.


