#### School Council News - Logo and Uniform

#### School Logo and Uniform

After nearly twelve months of discussions, consideration of parent/carers views through surveys in 2017, and the investigation of different options, School Council have made a decision on both the school logo and uniform.

There will be a <u>THREE YEAR</u> phase in period for the uniform change. During this time, students will be able to wear a mixture of the 'old and new'.

#### Logo

The new logo, reflects the school link with the Moonee Ponds Creek (which adds the Views to Gladstone), maintains the traditional green and yellow, and includes the addition of navy as the main colour for all uniform items.

#### Purchasing Shorts and Tracksuit Pants (no logo items)

Shorts and tracksuit pants will be available from the school uniform shop, however, these may also be purchased through retail outlets. Please ensure items are plain navy – no stripes or logos.

Students may choose to wear navy shorts or tracksuit pants from now on.

#### Wearing Logo Items

School Council have expressed a preference for all students to wear the 'official logo items' rather than plain t-shirts and jumpers. This provides children with a sense of belonging and a feeling of being in a team. Again, please note that there will be a three year phase in period, and is the case currently, please contact Cathie or Suzy for confidential assistance with uniforms

#### Purchasing Logo Items

All items, except the pinafore and rugby jumper will now be supplied by State Schools' Relief as they can provide uniforms at a reduced price.

State Schools' Relief have been providing children with uniforms for many years to ensure that all children have the opportunity to feel like they belong at school. Traditionally, this has been done on an individual application basis and while this service is still available, SSR can now supply schools in a retail manner.

#### **Reduced Costs for Uniforms**

By using State Schools' Relief we are able to provide uniform at a reduced cost and, at the same time, support their important community work.

Logos on school uniforms will be embroidered (not printed as is currently the case).

The Uniform Committee spent a lot of time discussing and deliberating before the School Council decision was made. Retaining some of the traditional yellow and green, and reducing the need to always be removing stains from yellow shirts were two of the many factors considered.
