Late Arrivals

It has been pleasing to note a reduction in the number of students arriving late to school each day so far this year. Arriving on time is extremely important for a number of reasons:

Anxiety

Students who arrive late often feel anxious as they know the school day has commenced and they have to walk into the classroom when everyone has started. This anxiety can reduce their capacity to learn until they settle.

Missed Opportunities

At the start of each day, teachers welcome students and go through the agenda for the day. This allows students to make the transition from home to school and prepares them for a day of learning. Often important information is communicated to students at this time. It is vital that students feel part of the class team which is established at this time.

Development of Habits

Punctuality is a habit and an important life skill and the foundation for this habit is developed when children are young. Children need to know that being 'on time' is important, shows respect and allows them to make the most of opportunities.

CURRICULUM GAZETTE

Last year, Mrs Black and Miss Steele participated in the Bastow Leading Literacy Course. The Professional Learning was based around effective writing instruction. Together, they deepened their knowledge about the Writer's Workshop Model, became experts on the 6+1 Traits of Writing and most importantly learned how to lead school change.

At Gladstone Views Primary School, 2020 has been named as 'The Year of the Writer'. We have started unpacking our instructional model- The Writer's Workshop.




In the Workshop Model, teachers explicitly teach one focus in their mini lesson. The focus of the lesson is decided on by the teacher from their ongoing monitoring of students' writing. The mini lesson is designed to explicitly teach our students skills and qualities of being a capable writer.

Following the mini lesson, students have the task to continue their writing and trial elements of the mini lesson in their own writing.



During worktime, students refer to our co created anchor charts.

Anchor charts are essentially used to anchor the lesson's learning in the students' memories so when they look at the chart, they can drag the mental anchor up in their mind, along with the mini lesson that went with it.



At the end of the lesson, we meet with our writing buddies. We listen to each other's work and offer feedback.

Some of us are even lucky enough to have an Author's Chair in our classrooms. This is where we celebrate our amazing achievements in Writing.

During our Curriculum Day on **Tuesday March 10**th we will have an amazing literacy consultant, **Narissa Leung**, who will be coming out to run a whole day professional learning with our staff. Narissa has asked our school to complete student surveys on writing. We will be unpacking this data and discussing it. Staff are also going to be students for the day. They will be students in a Writer's Workshop lesson and Narissa will be the teacher. We look forward to this powerful learning opportunity and cannot wait to implement more great ideas into our classrooms.
