Mr Pat has been supporting students in this program, which has been very well received.

This initiative complements other wellbeing supports at GVPS. Our Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) groups have begun for the term, led by our dedicated SEL teacher, Miss Andrea Evans. These small-group sessions are designed to support students who need extra help in developing self-regulation skills, navigating social situations, and building confidence so they feel ready to learn. The groups provide a safe space for students to reflect, connect, and grow.

We are also delighted that our much-loved Paw Pals Canine Therapy Program has returned this term, bringing smiles, comfort, and calm to our students. The presence of our trained therapy dogs continues to make a positive impact on student wellbeing and emotional regulation.

And there's more to come! We're excited to soon launch new physical education meets wellbeing initiatives, blending movement, mindfulness, and teamwork to further support our students' mental and physical health.

## 2025 Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey

## **Update on OSHC Program at Gladstone Views Primary School**

I am writing to provide an update regarding the current status of the **Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) program** at Gladstone Views Primary School.

On **Wednesday 30 July**, the Principal, Assistant Principal, and Business Manager met with the Department of Education's Finance Division. A key focus of this meeting was the **financial sustainability** of the GVPS OSHC program. It was noted that the program has been operating at a financial loss over the past 2 years, with a significant amount of debt still to be recovered from outstanding user fees, currently close to \$50,000. **Families with outstanding fees have received a letter of notice.** 

**Staffing costs for the program total approximately \$150,000 per year**, excluding further expenses such as food, program upgrades, resources, and the operation of the Holiday Program. These staffing requirements, along with other program costs, have contributed to the ongoing financial challenges.

In addition to financial concerns, the program has encountered a number of **administrative issues**, particularly related to billing and invoicing, which we understand have caused frustration for many families. We sincerely apologise for any inconvenience caused.

Unfortunately, the **ongoing financial burden** of the OSHC program is impacting the school's overall budget, including future staffing and our ability to provide additional resources and support for all students.

The Department of Education has recommended exploring the option of **transitioning to a privately managed OSHC service**, on the condition that any new provider can continue to meet the needs of our school and families. Please be assured that this would only be considered as a **last resort**, and I want to emphasise that I do not wish to make this decision lightly, given the importance of the current service.

I would like to take a moment to sincerely acknowledge the dedicated work of our current OSHC team—Courtney, Caitlin, and Emma. They consistently provide your children with a safe, supportive, and enjoyable environment, and their care, continuity, and deep understanding of each child are truly invaluable to our school community.

The School Council has been involved in ongoing discussions regarding OSHC, working closely with Courtney, our OSHC Manager. We want to emphasise that we deeply value the role the current OSHC program plays in supporting families, and we are committed to working collaboratively to ensure it continues to offer a high-quality, sustainable service.

We fully recognise and appreciate the importance of what Courtney, Caitlin, and Emma provide to families and children every day, and we are grateful for their ongoing dedication and care.

Thank you for your ongoing support and understanding.



#### **YEAR 5/6**

The last few weeks in 3/4 have been full of fun and learning! On Fridays we've been enjoying sport with our teachers and Mr Rex. We've played lots of different games and activities that keep us active, moving, and working as a team.

In Reading and Writing, we have been learning all about poetry. After finishing our explanation texts, we have loved exploring poems, playing with rhythm, rhyme, and creative language to share our ideas in new ways.

In Mathematics, we worked hard to finish our unit on fractions and are now practicing our multiplication quick facts. We've been building speed and confidence with times tables while also learning strategies to help us solve problems.

For Inquiry, we've been exploring the land and thinking about ways we can take care of it. We've also looked closely at the resources different countries use and compared how these can be the same or different. This has helped us understand how important it is to care for our world together.

We enjoyed some fantastic incursions that gave us new learning experiences right in our own classroom. Book Week was another highlight - everyone looked amazing in their dress ups, and we had so much fun taking part in the different activities and celebrating our love of reading together.

It's been another fantastic fortnight of learning in Year 5/6, with students diving deep into new areas of Writing, Inquiry, and Maths.

Students have begun crafting their own memoirs, reflecting on the important events that have shaped their lives. They are exploring how to use rich, descriptive language to bring their stories to life and learning to write in their own unique voice. It's been wonderful to see their confidence grow as authors who can share meaningful, personal stories.

Our Inquiry unit has taken us around the globel Students are busy researching different countries as we prepare for our exciting Travel Expo. They are discovering fascinating facts about geography, culture, and landmarks, and can't wait to showcase their learning to you soon.

In Maths, students are tackling the world of fractions.

They've been practising adding and subtracting fractions, exploring equivalent fractions, and building their knowledge of improper fractions and mixed numbers. Even the challenge of working with uncommon denominators has been met with enthusiasm and persistence.

It's been a busy and rewarding fortnight, and we can't wait to see what our students achieve next!

#### SPECIALIST: PHYSICAL EDECATION

#### Foundation:

Our youngest superstars have been busy weaving, dodging, and changing directions safely through fun games to start the term. More recently, they've jumped into soccer, keeping their eyes on the ball and kicking forward with growing confidence. Next up - AFL! We'll be learning the art of kicking the footy with the correct technique.

#### Years 1/2:

Students have been leaping, dodging, and moving like champions before shifting into soccer mode. They've been practising how to stop and kick using the inside of their foot with great progress. Coming up, the focus turns to AFL, where they'll tackle the drop punt and learn how to kick with accuracy.

#### Years 3/4:

These students teed off the term with golf, developing grip, swing, and consistency in hitting the ball. From there, they've transitioned into soccer, where dribbling, passing, and goal scoring have been the highlights. Next on the agenda is AFL, with a focus on handballing, kicking, and testing their skills in game simulations.

#### Years 5/6:

Our senior students also began the term on the golf course (well, the oval version at least!), sharpening their grip and technique to strike the ball consistently. Since then, they've been working hard on their soccer skills - dribbling, passing, scoring goals, and putting their techniques into action in game situations. Next up, it's time for some AFL fun, as they work on handballing, kicking, and game play strategies.

#### **FOUNDATION**

**YEAR 1/2** 

This week in Foundation, we've been building our literacy skills by exploring CCVCC words, using them in sentences, and making connections with texts to support reading for meaning. In Maths, we've started our measurement unit, focusing on length and height, while continuing to practise number bonds to 10 and hands-on strategies for addition and subtraction. In Inquiry, we've begun designing our own special places and choosing materials to build dioramas with our Grade 5 buddies. We've also been learning how to stay safe at school by making good choices and caring for others.

A highlight this term was our fun and engaging Book Week celebrations! Through our Developmental Play Space, we continue to grow our creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving skills. In Literacy, we have been writing fantastic narratives, focusing on the key elements of a story and exploring how to make our writing engaging and exciting for the reader.

In Mathematics, we have been diving into multiplication, using hands-on materials to practise making equal groups and creating arrays to represent multiplication problems.

In Inquiry, we have been examining how technology has improved people's access to different places, as well as considering how where you live can affect the things you do.

We also enjoyed taking part in an incursion run by Yarra Valley Water, where we learned about the importance of conserving water. Looking ahead, we are very excited for our upcoming Fairy Tale Fiasco incursion next week—we love any opportunity to perform!





# **Kindergarten at Gladstone Views Primary School – Project Update** (Opening 2026)

I would like to provide an update on the new **on-site kindergarten at Gladstone Views Primary School**, which is set to open in **2026**.

The **Department of Education** is currently in the design and tender phase of the project, working to appoint the team who will oversee the delivery of the build. The kindergarten facility will be constructed off-site and then transported to GVPS, where on-site preparation and installation will take place.

From recent conversations with the Central Team, construction is anticipated to begin during the **end-of-year school holidays** and continue into **Term 1, 2026**. A contingency plan is also being considered to ensure that children enrolled in the 2026 kindergarten program will be able to attend kinder on the school site during the early part of 2026 while construction is underway.

I understand there have been concerns regarding enrolments for 2026 and the allocation of days of attendance. I have been working closely with the team to communicate these concerns, and I will provide a further update in the next edition of the newsletter.
