

What is a composite class?

Composite classes are where children from two or more grade levels are in the same class.

Why does and why might GVPS have composite classes?

The composite structure allows teachers to best meet the learning needs of our students whilst also allowing for even class sizes across the school.

How do you teach children in different grade levels in the same class?

Even in a straight class, there are children with different learning levels as all children learn at a different pace and have different learning styles. All GVPS teachers spend time every week, planning to meet the different learning needs of all children. This is called <u>differentiation</u>. Every lesson is presented with a **Learning Intention** that explains the skill being covered in the lesson. The **Success Criteria** are the expectations that children work towards to acquire the skill and cover a range of learning abilities and levels. In addition, our teachers work with small groups or one to one to ensure that your child is challenged at their point of need.

How can there be so many different levels in one class?

There can be up to eight different levels in one class- even if it is a straight year level! This variation of learning levels is nothing new to GVPS teachers and our teachers are experienced with tailoring their instruction to meet the needs of all children. Further to this, students have the opportunity to develop relationships with a wider number of peers.

Will my child be disadvantaged in a composite class?

No. Your child will receive the same education as if they were in a straight class. Teachers tailor all lessons to target the individual learning needs of each child in their class. This happens with a straight or composite class.

Who made this decision to have composite classes?

Class structure is a school-based decision and there are many tiers of input before a class and class structures are confirmed. DET input from Senior Educational and Financial liaisons, Consultative Committee, Australian Education Union representatives and staff inclusive of teaching, educational support and administrative. Considerable planning is undertaken with the leading question- "Which structure will best support our students to be successful learners?".

How can I support my child with their learning?

You can ask your child about their learning goals in Reading, Writing and Numeracy. How they are going with their goals. Have a look at our curriculum newsletters that are sent home every term and familiarise yourself with what your child is learning. Ask questions about what is going well and what they are working on. Come along to our school events such as *Meet the Teacher* and *open afternoons* that showcase learning. Get involved- for example become a classroom volunteer or support our P&C.

Who can I speak to if I have questions regarding my child's learning?

Your child's teacher is the first point of contact. Our teachers are always happy to discuss your child and their learning. Please contact them via Class Dojo to make a mutually convenient time to discuss your child and their learning.
