

We were recently notified that our application for a Shade Sail Grant has been approved. The funding will provide Shade Sails for the seated area located near the front entrance of the school. This space will benefit from additional shade and be established as outdoor learning spaces. It is expected that the work to install these shade structures be completed mid-year.



Attendance-Every Day Counts!

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

SCHOOL IS BETTER WHEN YOUR CHILD IS THERE- Why it's important?

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates.

It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick. Developing good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

Family holidays - It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term. If you are planning to go on holiday during term time, make sure you discuss your holiday plans with the Principal.

Dear parents and carers

Alongside ventilation and other vital COVIDSafe steps such as regular rapid antigen testing, supporting students to be vaccinated is helping make schools as safe as possible. Getting your child vaccinated is the best way you can protect your child, your family and your school community from further outbreaks and the spread of COVID-19.

First-dose COVID-19 vaccinations for children aged 5 to 11 started from Monday 10 January 2022. If you have not done so yet, I would encourage you to book a first-dose COVID-19 vaccine appointment for your children aged 5 to 11 as soon as possible.

Some 5 to 11 year old children who received their first dose early in January are now eligible for their second-dose.

By vaccinating your children, you can give them direct protection against COVID-19. While children and young people are less likely than adults to experience severe symptoms if they contract

COVID-19, some may still get very sick. Children can also transmit COVID-19, meaning that vaccination helps reduce transmission to other children and older people, including family members who may be at higher risk, such as grandparents.

How to book an appointment

There are lots of convenient options to get your child vaccinated, including statewide vaccination clinics, your local GP or pharmacy, and pop-up clinics at many local primary schools.

You can book your appointment in a few different ways, including:

- online: coronavirus.vic.gov.au/vaccine
- by phone: 1800 675 398 (Coronavirus Hotline)
- In person: talk to your local pharmacy, doctor, or a family-friendly vaccination centre

Many vaccination centres offer walk-ins for anyone aged 5 and older. Children aged 5 to 11 years old must be accompanied by a parent or guardian who can provide consent for the vaccination.

Vaccination centres understand that children may feel anxious about vaccination or have other support needs. A range of options are available to help children get vaccinated. Please discuss your child's needs when you book an appointment. To find out more, visit vaccination for kids.

ONLINE ORDERING Your child's school photos are now available for secure online purchase, please note if you are ordering online, you do not need to return an envelope to the school

Step 1: Click Here - For online ordering process for your school.

Step 2: Enter your student's details

Step 3: Choose the package that best suits your needs (all orders will be returned to the school for collection)

Step 4: Pay for the photos via the shopping cart (upper right corner of the page)

**Online Orders have a 1.5% merchant fee applied when using Visa, Mastercard or PayPal.

Please Note: If you miss photo day, portrait and group packages can still be ordered online for 7 days afterwards with no late fees. After that time, late orders will require separate processing and handling and therefore will incur a \$15 late fee per package.



Fire Education incursion - Foundation

We had a very special visit from the Tullamarine Fire Fighters on Tuesday 15th March. A team of four fire fighters came to GVPS to speak to the Foundation children about what to do in the case of an emergency such as a fire. The children were able to identify safe and unsafe fires as well as see the protective clothing and gear fire fighters wear when extinguishing a fire. They got to see the fire truck up close, but the big highlight of the day was getting to hold the fire hose and squirt the water across the Foundation area.

The children were encouraged to go home and talk to their family about checking smoke alarms and to plan a safe meeting place in the unfortunate event of a fire emergency. The most important thing to remember in a fire is to call 000 and to Crawl Down Low and Go Go Go!

A huge thank you to David Garvin who offered to run the Fire Ed Program to the Foundation students, it was a very valuable learning experience!
