Hi Everyone,

If your child/ren has any COVID symptoms, such as a cough, runny nose, sneezing, fever or sore throat, you must keep them home until symptoms ease. It would also be advisable to re-test them before they return to school.

NAPLAN Test Online Trials

Last week our students in Years 3 and 5, took part in a NAPLAN trial test. This was part of our school readiness process which was held to test our school's capacity to run multiple devices through our Wi-Fi Network at once. In the coming week, these students will undergo another trial test as part of the Statewide Readiness trial. All of this is to ensure that come May when we sit the actual NAPLAN testing, the system within our school and across the state can cope. This is required given all NAPLAN tests this year will need to be completed online.

Progress Reports

The leadership team analysed the 2021 Parent Opinion to School Survey and have taken on board feedback from parents/carers in regards to 'teachers communicate with me often enough about my child's progress'. Therefore, teachers in Term 1 and Term 3 will be completing Progress Reports.

Teachers will be reporting on students' progress in Reading, Writing, Numeracy, classroom behaviours and yard behaviours for Term 1.



The purpose of Progress Reports is to provide parents/carers with an indication of how their child/ren has performed in Term 1.

Progress Reports will be sent out to parents through the Compass App on Friday April 8th. If you have any questions regarding Progress Reports, please speak to your child's classroom teacher.

During the Open Morning, current and prospective families will be able to take part in a guided tour with our student leaders to see our classrooms and all our school has to offer.




Our current Foundation teaching team will also be present to answer any questions you may have. Student performances will also occur.

Step 2: Enter your student's details


Step 3: Choose the package that best suits your needs (all orders will be returned to the school for collection)
