What makes a good learner? After working with a positive psychologist and a Teaching and Learning Coach over the past few years, I now encourage children in a different way that is way more effective.

Did you realise that if you keep telling children they are smart, they may not want to tackle a difficult problem down the track. They may want to keep their reputation for being smart intact.

However, **if you praise your child for the EFFORT** they put into something, they are more likely to tackle that difficult problem and maybe even become one of our future leaders.

Try this; "Oh! Wow! You must have worked really hard to do this. I am so proud of you".

**Encourage your child to accept mistakes as a learning process.** If you are not making mistakes, you are not learning. If a child is not making mistakes, they are not being challenged. Good teachers try to aim the work at a level just above your child's assessed level so they are engaged and stimulated.

Give good quality feedback to children. Instead of saying"That's good", say "I like the way you used dark lines to"....or "tried to connect those things together" etc..... "Have you ever thought about".... Constantly praising effort, attitude and manners will most definitely result in hard working, well-mannered children who grow up to be great adults.


