What is Autism?

Autism is a lifelong neurodevelopmental condition that affects the way that people communicate and interact with others. Autistic people may display some of the characteristics in the two main areas below:

Social Communication and Social Interaction

Finds two-way conversations difficult

Fishe has on your entropy on your

- May find it difficult to start, maintain, or end a conversation
- May find it hard to stay on topic



Needs help to interact with others

Difficulty reading social cues or situations

- May prefer to be alone
- May want to join in but not know how
- May find it difficult to form and maintain social relationships

Seems uninterested



- May avoid eye contact
- May not respond to name
- May appear to be in their own world

Needs help with communication



- May have delayed or limited speech
- Tends to interpret language literally
- May have a large vocabulary but struggle with social use of language



May find it hard to read body language, facial expressions, and tone of

 May need help to understand what behaviour is appropriate in different environments

Behaviour, Interests and Activities

Repetitive behaviours



 May repeat the same action over and over e.g. lining up objects or watching the same movie repeatedly

Restrictive interests



- May have an intense interest in one topic (e.g. trains)
- May have an interest that is unusual (e.g. gluesticks)
- May have an unusual level of interest in a topic

Repetitive body movements



- May display echolalia (repeating words or phrases)
- May display handflapping, spinning, rocking etc

Under- or over-responsive senses



 May have unusual reactions to what they see, hear, smell, touch or taste etc.

Prefers structure and routine



- May not like surprises or change
- Needs to be prepared and supported to try new things
