Ambulance Attendance at School



Fortunately, most parents don't know Ambulance what happens when children require emergency assistance at school. Many of you would have seen ambulances at the

school last week, and so it seems an opportune time to provide you with some information regarding our school processes.

In any situation in which we are concerned of a child's health or wellbeing an ambulance will be called. Our first priority is to log the call and get an ambulance dispatched. As soon as possible after this we endeavour to make contact with parents/carers.

If parents/carers are not able to arrive at the school prior to the ambulance departing a staff member will travel and stay with your child until a family member is able to resume duty of care.
