

School Uniform

Every day there seems to be more children proudly arriving in the new navy uniform. From talking to parents I understand that the quality of the materials is considered to be very good and the prices more than reasonable.

As you would be aware, during the change-over period the green/gold items may still be worn, and can be worn in combination with the new blue items.

However, there are some items appearing that are not School Council approved uniform.



<u>Shirts</u>

Students can wear a short sleeved polo or a long sleeved polo. All polo tops should have the school logo.

Long sleeved tops under short sleeved school polo shirts is not uniform.

Coloured t-shirts under short sleeved school polo shirts is not uniform.

If children are cold they should wear a singlet/top that can't be seen and/or a jumper.

Jumpers/Jackets

New uniform navy options are the rugby top and polar fleece jacket.

Green/gold uniform choices are the bomber jacket, rugby top and windcheater.

All jumpers and jackets should have the school logo.

Shorts and Track Pants

Shorts and track pants whether green or navy should be plain with no stripes or logos. These items do not have logos and may be purchased at retail outlets of your choice.



Dresses and Pinafores

The green checked dress is being phased out and replaced by the blue and white checked dress.

The school pinafore remains unchanged - navy with gold and green highlights.

Skorts, plain skirts and netball skirts are not school uniform (despite what your child might tell you!).



The new uniform hat is a navy bucket hat.

Uniform Costs

If, for any reason, you are not able to afford uniform for your child please see Cathie or Suzy. Our aim, along with School Council, is to ensure that all children have access to the same uniform as this promotes a sense of team and belonging.



Meeting with Your Child's Teacher

Our staff welcome opportunities to talk with parents. A positive partnership with home has been shown to improve student outcomes and often dealing with issues early on prevents them from becoming huge concerns.

If you would like to talk to your child's class teacher we ask that you contact the office to make an appointment.

While teachers enjoy exchanging

greetings with parents before school, conversations at this time impact on classroom organisation and the commencement of learning.

Now that even the Prep students have mastered morning routines we ask that parents promote independence by encouraging children of all ages to enter classrooms independently.
